

Thankyou to the members who were able to attend.



IW Day celebrations, 10th January, 2024 have been changed from Government House to Parliament house, BUT still need to be confirmed. May return to Botanical Gardens.

Research here includes, M.S., IBS and Colitis, Weight loss, Complementary treatment to decrease damage from Chemo, Cardio vascular disease, and Exercise training benefits.

Facilities include Imaging, Exercise equipment for Mice, and a Procedure Room.Surplus T Rolls now go to Peter Mac Research. Logo "ROLL on RESEARCH'

Mat gives away his 3 D hands for Free Sharing his knowledge with such glee Environmentally friendly are his artificial hands Made from biodegradable cornstarch brands




Some Thoughts to Ponder

GARLIC PARMESAN ROASTED CARROTS

(if you don't like garlic - just leave it out- but it's good for you) Adjust ingredients according to the quantity of carrots. I used smallish carrots and quartered them

1KG or what you want of carrots, 1/4 cup olive oil 4 large cloves garlic 1/4 cup parmesan cheese 2 tabs Panko bread crumbs Salt and pepper.

Pre heat oven to 200 deg C.

Lightly grease a baking tray.

Place all ingredients in a freezer bag and toss well.

Spread out on the baking tray.

Bake about 25-30 mins depending on size you have cut the carrots
